The meeting will inform parents on what aspects of the curriculum will be assessed, and how the test process is undertaken for pupils in Y2.

Uniform

Please can I remind you that the Academy Council of St John's has a clear uniform policy which should be adhered to at all times. Children should not be wearing trainers to school but sensible black school shoes. Wellingtons and boots can be worn on days of severe weather to come to and leave school. Shaved haircuts or those following the current trend are not allowed in school. We have had a number of children coming into school in the last few weeks which is against the uniform policy. We would also encourage children with long hair to have this tied up and headbands to be of a sensible size.

At St John's part of our identity is our school uniform and we pride ourselves on this. Therefore, I urge parents, to ensure that children are sent to school wearing the correct uniform in January

GIRLS: Grey pinafore or skirt, grey tailored trousers, plain white shirt or blouse, navy knitted cardigan or jumper with school logo, school tie, indoor black pumps, sensible black shoes.

Summer – Blue and white checked dresses with white socks.

BOYS: Grey tailored trousers, white shirt, navy knitted jumper with school logo, school tie, indoor black pumps and sensible black shoes.

Summer - Grey shorts. Short sleeve white shirt

PE – Plain Navy blue shorts and plain white T- Shirt Plain Navy Jogger bottoms and Navy sweatshirt Trainers for outdoor PE

The school badge can be added to your jumper or cardigan that you are able to purchase at a variety of retailers at So This in Assembly Street in Normanton.

Please ensure that all items of uniform and PE kit are clearly labelled with your child's name.
